at St. Stephen's Episcopal Parish - SW 13th & Clay St, Portland, OR

A Community Space With A Mission To Serve

Located adjacent to the downtown PSU campus, St. Stephen's Episcopal Parish has transitioned from a dedicated worship space into a mixed-use community space. While we still have services on Sundays and other significant church dates, our large and attractive spaces can now be more fully utilized by opening them to diverse community needs. This includes lectures, educational programs, body work, meditation training, rehearsals, & music events.



The main sanctuary is an open and flexible space. The fixed pews were removed and replaced with 175 comfortable stacking chairs. With 3,000 square feet of space plus a 350 sq ft stage area, it can easily accommodate food service, multiple dining tables, and still have room for seating and a large performance stage.

Also available: a 1,360 sq ft Parish Hall with an adjacent commercial kitchen and 240 sq ft meeting room, plus a cozy 350 sq ft Chapel with flexible seating configurations.

Facilities

About St. Stephen's Episcopal Parish

One of the first churches in Portland, St. Stephen's opened its doors in 1863 at its original location where Portland's City Hall now stands. By 1890 a new, expanded church was established at its current location of SW 13th & Clay St. along with separate Episcopal schools for boys and girls (now Oregon Episcopal Schools). In 1924, a fire destroyed a majority of the church, but by 1925 the building we still use today was completed and reopened.

St. Stephen's has a long history of community service. While speaking at the 1863 dedication, Bishop Thomas Scott committed St. Stephens to "... welcome the stranger and sojourner, the poor and the habitual neglecter of God's House". Through the years St. Stephen's has established missions, supported the city's poor, sponsored community food programs, established a mission for African-American Episcopalians, and provided services for Chinese immigrants. For the past 15 years St. Stephens has hosted Operation Nightwatch, a three-night per week hospitality ministry serving our unhoused neighbors.
